ENSEMBLE

(ahn SOM bul) *n.*

a coordinated outfit or costume;
a musical group

Link: **HANDSOME DEVIL**



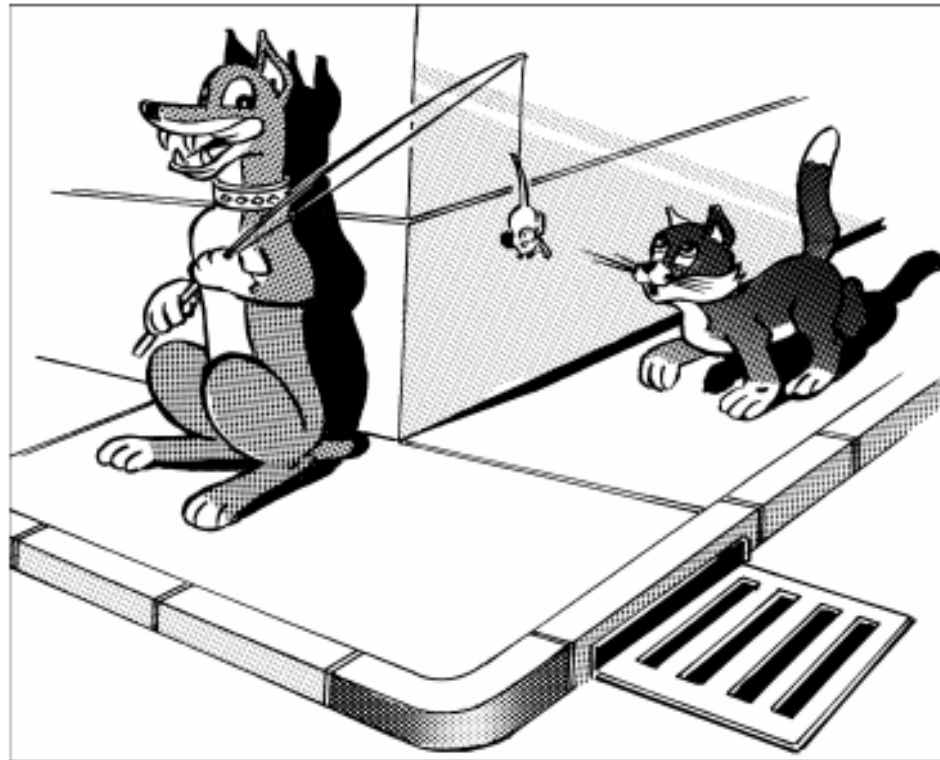
*"James Bond was a **HANDSOME DEVIL** in his spy **ENSEMBLE**."*

(in TICE) v.

to lure, to attract, to tempt

Link: **MICE**



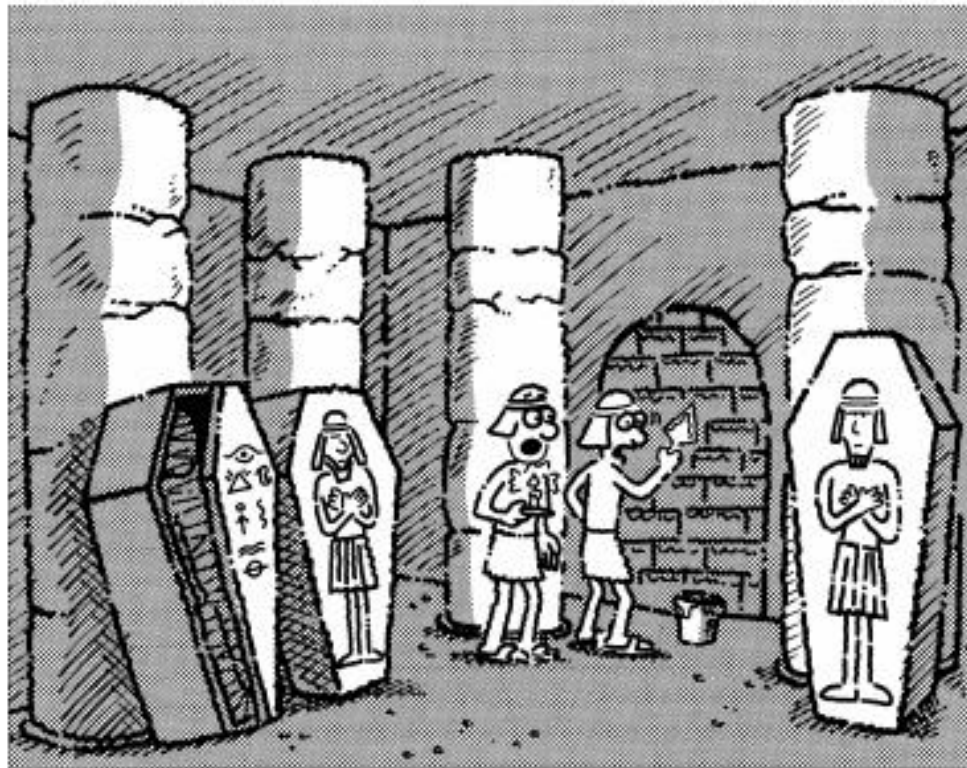
"Fido uses MICE to ENTICE cats."

(in TOOM) v.

to place in or as if in a tomb, or a grave

ENTOMBED us in the burial ROOM.”*

ENTOMOLOGY

(en tuh MOL uh jee) *n.*
the scientific study of insects

ENTREAT

(en TREET) v.

to ask earnestly; to implore, plead, beg

Link: **TREAT**

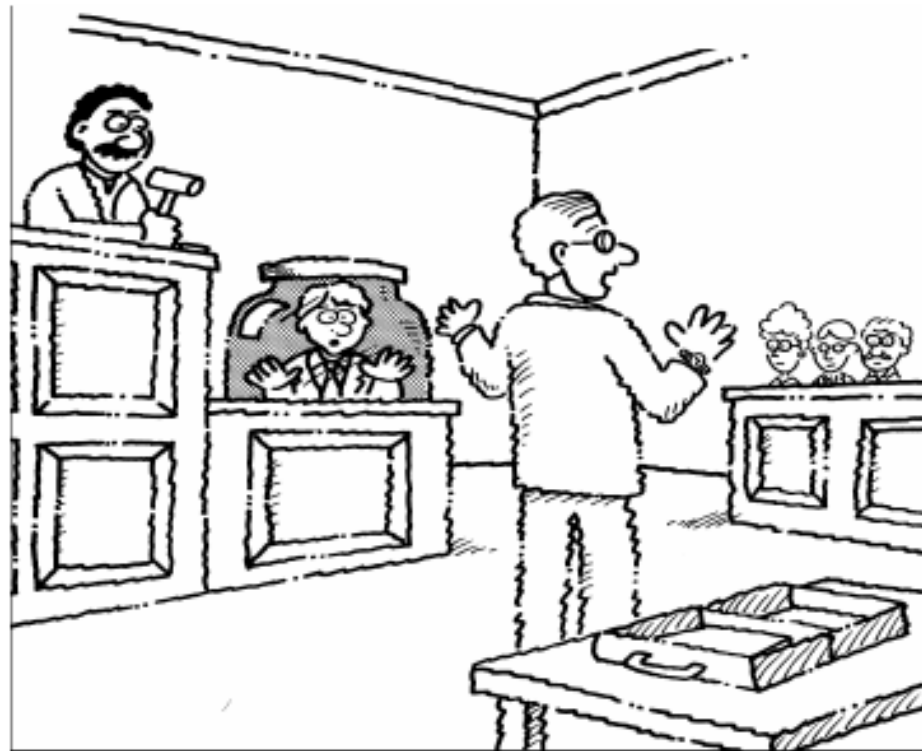


*“What is more common than a child **ENTREATING** a parent for a **TREAT** of candy or ice cream.”*

ERUDITE

(ER yoo dyte) *adj.*
deeply learned, scholarly

Link: **AIRTIGHT**

EUPHONIOUS

(yoo PHONE ee us)
pleasing to the ear

Link: **YOU PHONE US**

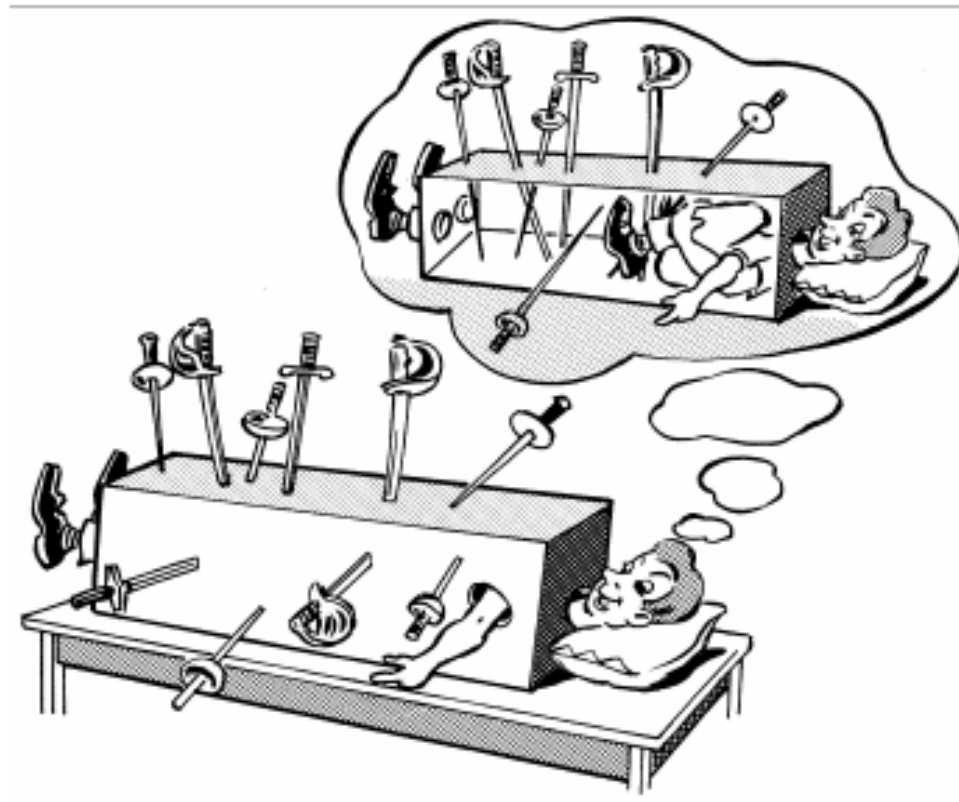


*"You must be beautiful because

EVADE

(ee VAYD) v.
to elude or avoid by cunning;
to flee from a pursuer

EVOKE

(ee VOHK) v.

to summon forth, call to mind,
awaken, produce, suggest

Link: **COKE**



*"Sometimes a song, a picture, even
a **COKE**, can **EVOKE** the most
poignant of youthful memories."*

EXHUME

(ig ZOOM) v.

to dig up from a grave;
to bring to light, uncover

Link: **TOMB**



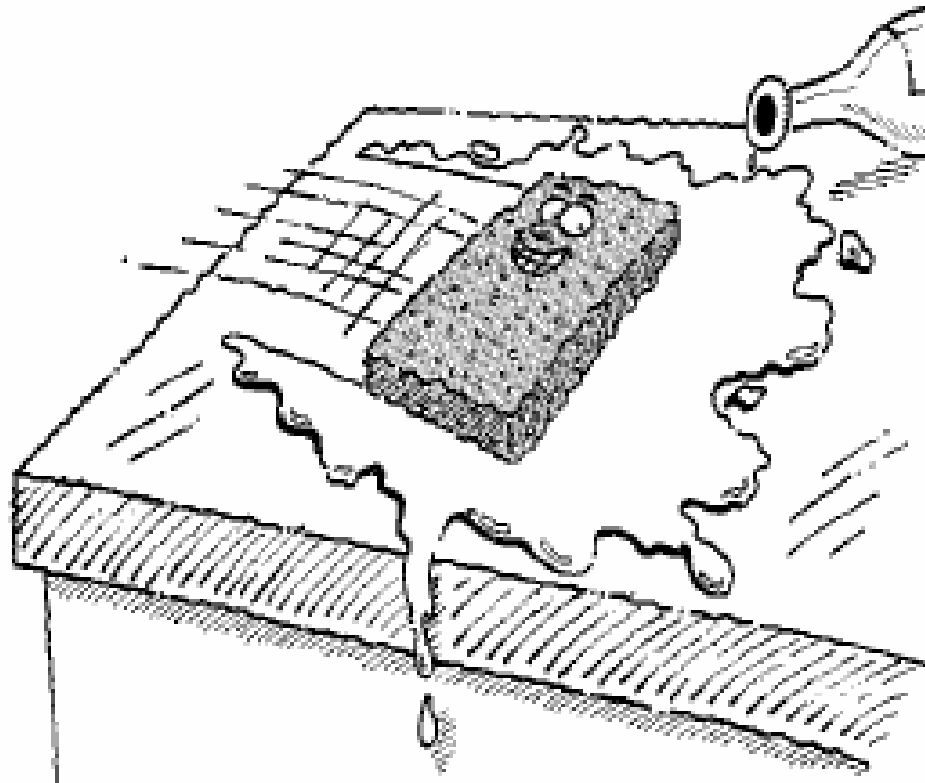
"Archeologists like to EXHUME TOMBS."

EXPUNGE

(iks PUNJ) v.

to remove; to delete; to erase

Link: **SPONGE**

FACILITATE

(fuh SIL uh tayt) v.
to make easier, to help bring about

Link: **CELL MATE**

a homey atmosphere."*

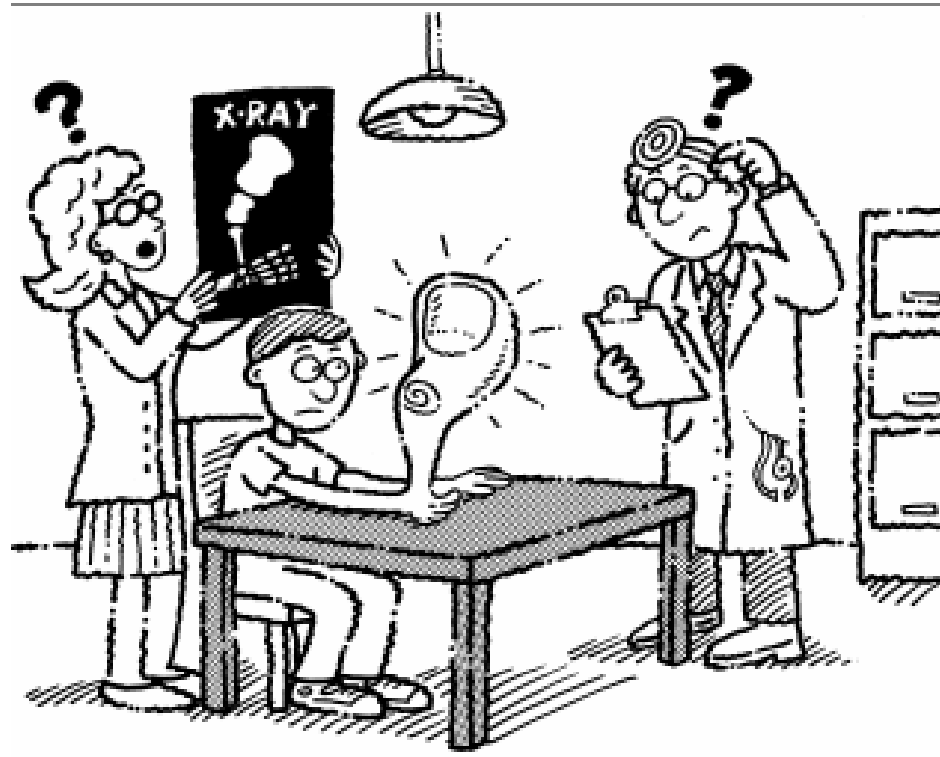
FATHOM

(fa THUM) v.

to understand fully;

to penetrate the meaning of

Link: **FAT THUMB**



*"Doctors could never **FATHOM** the reason for Larry's **FAT THUMB**."*

FAWN

(fawn) v.
to show affection

Link: **FAWN**



"A FAWN FAWNING over his mother."

FEIGN

(fayn) v.

to give a false
appearance; to pretend

Link: **INSANE**



*"The prisoner **FEIGNED INSANITY**
as a defense to his crime."*

FESTER

(FES tur) v.

to generate pus; to become a source of resentment or irritation

Link: **UNCLE FESTER**



*"UNCLE FESTER likes to pick his scabs
and watch them FESTER."*

FETISH

(FET ish) *n.*

an object of unreasonable,
obsessive reverence or attention

Link: **BRITISH**



*"The **BRITISH**, they say, have
an absolute **FETISH** for tea.*

FICKLE

(FIK ul) *adj.*

often changing for no reason;
not loyal or consistent

Link: **PICKLE**



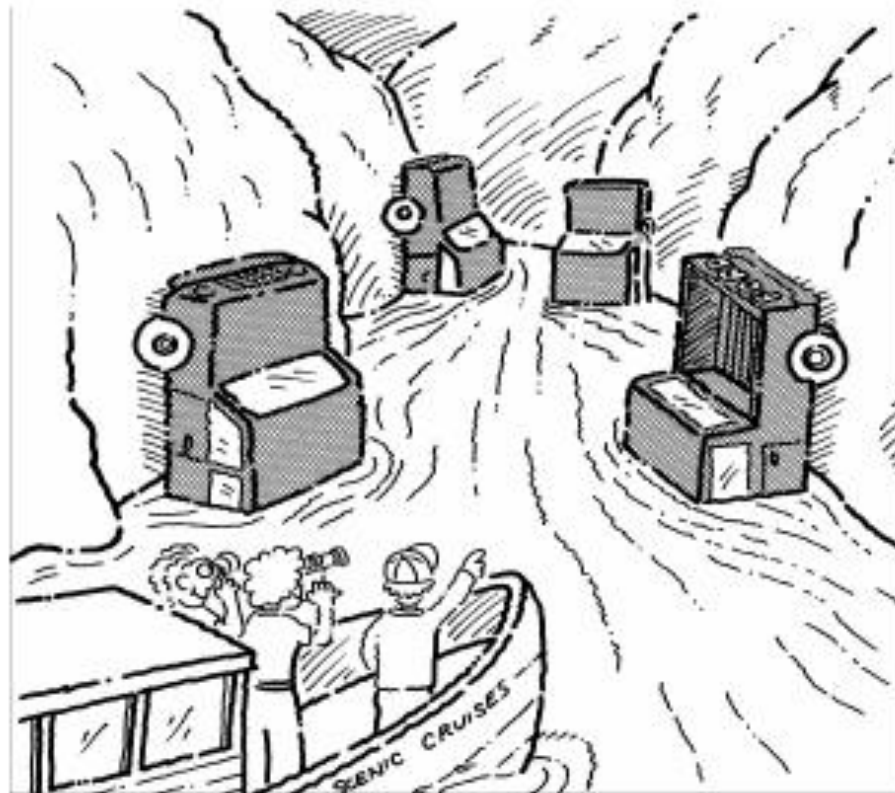
*"Pregnant women are very **FICKLE**; one moment they want ice cream, the next, **PICKLES**."*

FJORD

(fyord) *n.*

a long narrow inlet from the sea
between steep cliffs or hills

Link: **FORD**



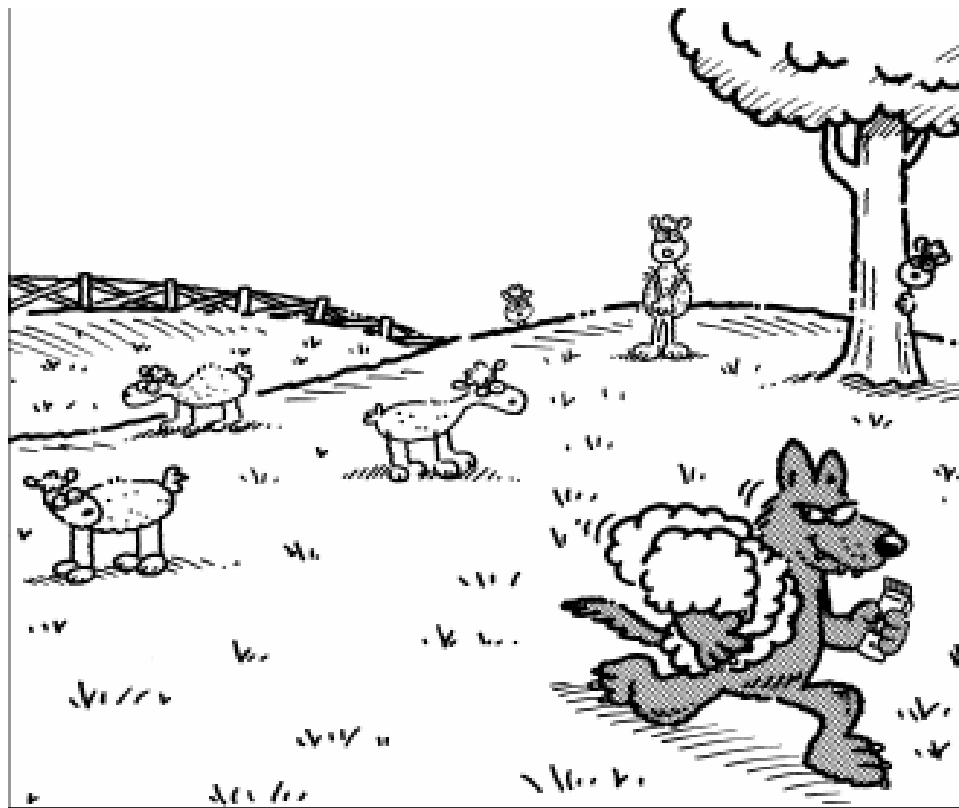
"FORDS in a FJORD"

FLEECE

(flees) v./n.

to defraud, swindle; also the wool of a sheep or similar animal
